

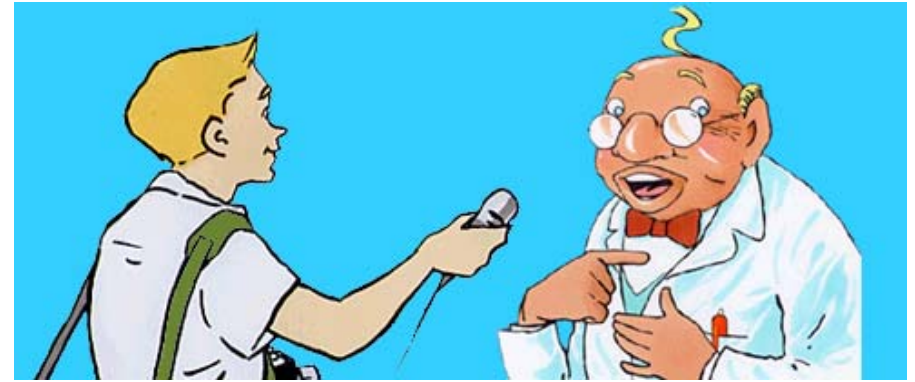

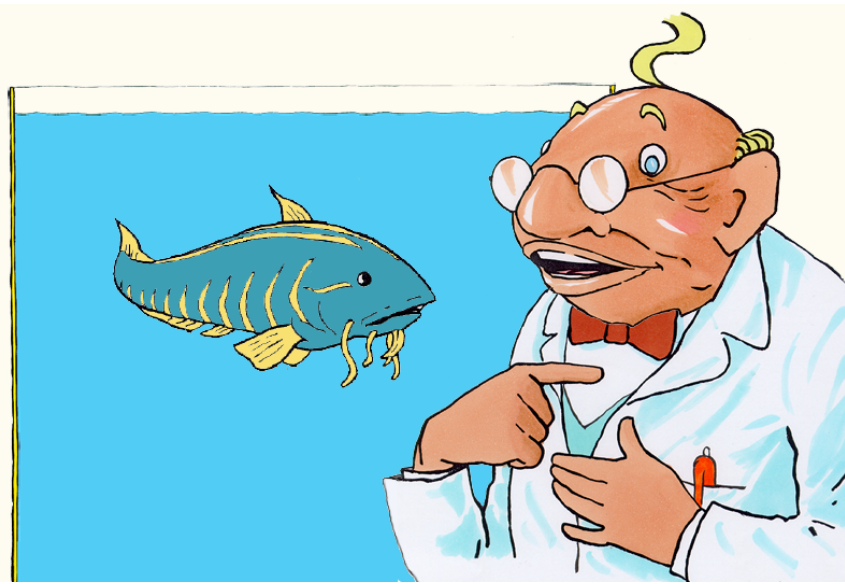


Zoologist

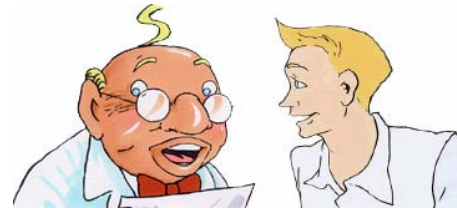
