

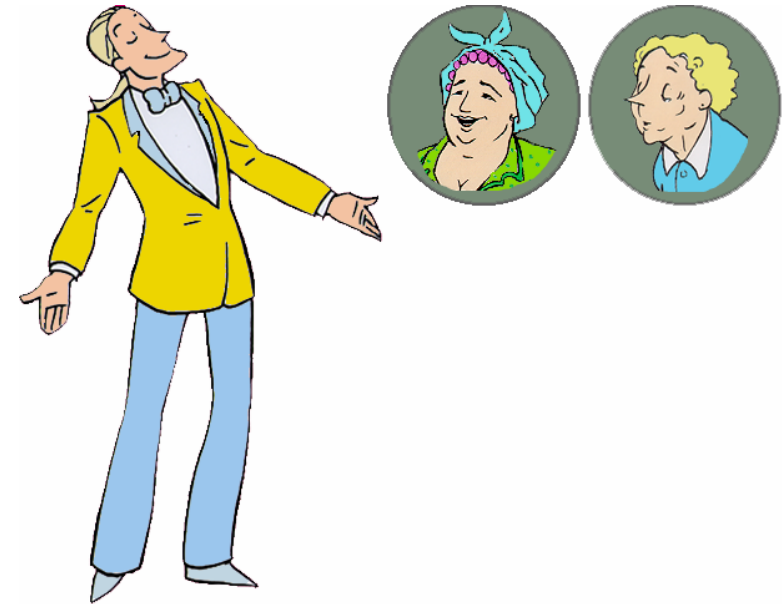

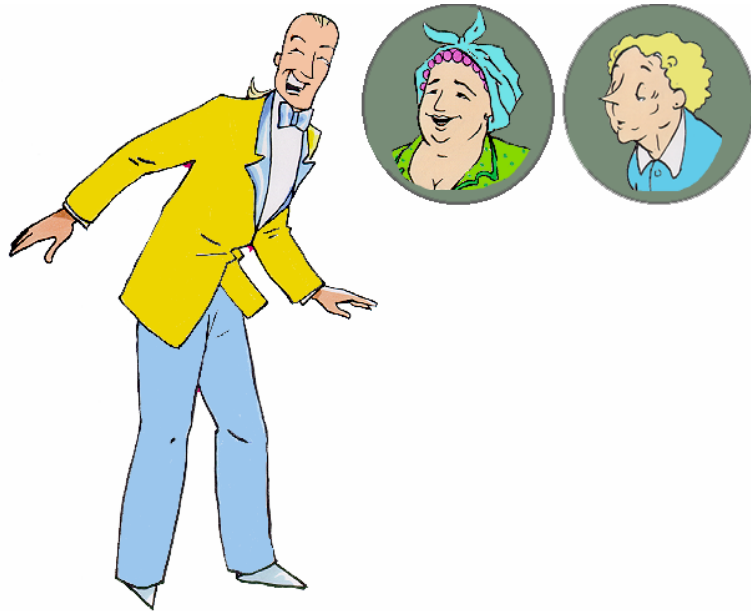


TV presenter
